

ELECTION EXPRESS

This Alert contains basic information about Mail-in and In-person voting in the upcoming 2022 Primary, and a statement on Judicial and non-partisan candidates. It is very important that you refer to the Sample Ballot Booklet that you recently received either on-line or in paper form for **LOCATIONS, DATES, and TIMES** for both **Early and Election Day Voting**. Our ballot for this year's election is a one page document.

JUDICIAL and NONPARTISAN CANDIDATES

Our Club has a tradition of formulating a list of candidates in Nonpartisan Judicial Races that identifies those candidates who are Democrats. Members anticipate this list and we take it seriously.

- This year there is only one Judicial Race on the Ballot: for Henderson Municipal Court Judge. Through extensive research we are **NOT** able to identify any of the three candidates listed as Democrats.
- There are two Democrats in the City of Henderson City Council Ward III race. Both candidates, Rice and Tyson, have been to our Club Meetings many times. In a Primary election the Dems Club does not endorse any Democratic candidate if there are two or more in any race.
- For the Regent State University District 6 race Heather Brown and Karl Katarata are Democrats but we were not able to determine what party the other two are affiliated with.
- Further there are no Democrats in the Sheriff race. However Kevin McMahill did come to our April meeting to speak to our members.
- As for the City of Henderson Mayor race there is not a single democrat or even democratic leaning candidate.

HOW TO VOTE

1. Mail-in Ballots. All registered, active voters will receive a ballot in the mail. Fill out your ballot (no need to vote for every office), seal it in its

included pre-paid postage envelope, SIGN THE ENVELOPE on the outside, and drop it in the mailbox.

- Ballots must be postmarked ON or BEFORE Tuesday, June 14, 2022, and received by 5:00 PM on Saturday, June 18, 2022.
- Mail ballots arrive by Wednesday, May 25, 2022, if you do not receive your mail ballot by the beginning of Early Vote May 28, 2022 immediately contact your local Elections Department at (702) 455-8683 for Clark County.
- Ballot Drop-off. Instead of mailing your ballot, fill it out as described above, SIGN THE ENVELOPE, and drop off at any Early Voting site or Election Day vote center of your choice from May 28-June 10, 2022 or June 14, 2022.
- For a list and schedule for drop-off locations in Clark County, refer to Sample Ballot Booklet. Another person can mail or drop-off your completed ballot for you at any Early Vote or Election Day location. There is no limit to the number of ballots a person may drop off.

2. Vote In-Person during early voting, May 28-June 10, 2022 or on Election Day, June 14, 2022. You will be required to “surrender” your blank mail-in ballot, or

sign a form that says you will not attempt to vote with that mail-in ballot.

- See a list of early vote locations for Clark County in your Sample Ballot Booklet. You may register to vote, drop off your ballot, or vote in-person at these locations.
- For Election Day locations, find Clark County Election Day locations in your Sample Ballot Booklet.
- Remember: if you vote using the ballot you receive in the mail SIGN THE OUTSIDE of the envelope on the designated line. This is how your County or City Clerk will verify your ballot. If you don't sign, your County or City's Election Department will attempt to contact you to verify your ballot. If you don't respond, your ballot will NOT be counted! Sign your ballot!
